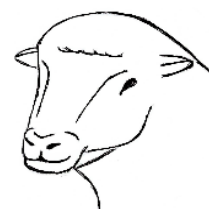
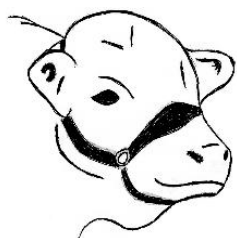

RULES & NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

ALL ENTRIES TO BE SUBMITTED ON THE OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM BY THE CLOSING DATE

PLEASE NOTE: The show premises is a Non-Smoking & Non-Vaping area

No Dogs Except Assistance Dogs allowed on the show premises

CATTLE AND SHEEP EXHIBITS to be tethered/penned between 8.00 and 10.00am

JUDGING will commence at 10.30am promptly for Cattle & 10.15am for Sheep.

All other exhibits to be in place by 9.30am for judging to commence promptly

Farm Crops and Vegetable Entries may be staged on Friday 13th November approx. 6.00 – 8.00 pm.

PRESENTATION OF TROPHIES - 3.00pm.

ENTRANCE FEES Cattle - £4 and Sheep - £2 per entry

EXHIBITS MUST NOT be removed before 4.00pm **LIVESTOCK** may leave at 3.30pm

EXHIBITORS may only make two entries in the same class, unless otherwise stated

POINTS will be awarded as follows: - 1st 3 points, 2nd 2 points, 3rd 1 point – in the event of a tie, the winner will be the exhibitor with the most 1st prizes. The decision of the sub-committee will be final

THE SOCIETY will not accept any responsibility for any accidents or loss that may occur, and Exhibitors must recognize this as a condition of entry.

Livestock Exhibitors must have adequate public liability insurance for the show – minimum £5,000,000

THE SOCIETY reserves the right to exclude and remove any animal unruly & fractious

THE SOCIETY reserves the right to exclude and remove any animal showing signs of disease or illness

All Exhibitor electrical equipment must be PAT tested, electrical appliances only be used in designated area

Photographs will be taken on show day and may be used for publicity and social media, acceptance of this a condition of entry, excludes children without express permission.

In case of doubt, dispute or protest, such protests are to be given in writing to the Secretary before the presentation of the Cups. Any person making a protest must at the time deposit £20 which will be refunded on his producing satisfactory evidence in support of the protest, but should he not sustain the protest the amount will be forfeited to the funds of the Society. The decision of the sub-committee in all cases is final. (Head of section plus 2 committee members will form the sub-committee)

The false representation of any entry will result in elimination and if applicable reported to the relevant authority. Failure to comply with these rules could result in the disqualification from entering future shows for a period of time at the committee's discretion

The Committee reserves the right to amalgamate any classes due to insufficient entries and amend any class details due to typing errors in the schedule.

The Committee reserves the right to cancel the livestock section of the show at any time, best efforts will be made to notify exhibitors as soon as possible should this occur.

All cups and plates remain the property of Helston Fatstock Society and must be returned prior to the next annual show, with exception of the Presidents trophy.

Once presented it is the responsibility of the winner to keep trophies in their safe custody, insure trophies against loss or damage, engrave and care for, return the trophies in a clean, undamaged state.

THE SOCIETY reserves the right to charge for any trophy not returned or not returned in a good condition

WHEN UNLOADING/LOADING all cattle must be halter led from/into lorries/trailers

ALL CATTLE will be weighed on arrival. Should any animal entered in class 7 or 8 be out with the weight range for that class it will then be automatically entered into the correct class and must be exhibited. However, should an animal entered in class 7 be 560k-570k on the show day then the exhibitor will have the option to withdraw from the class. No refund of entry fee given.

EACH BULLOCK ENTERED IS ONLY ELIGIBLE TO ENTER ONE CLASS BETWEEN CLASSES 1 AND 6 INCLUSIVE

ALL CATTLE ENTERED MUST COME FORWARD

100% British Native breed, excluding South Devon

4. Fat steer or heifer born on or before 1st March 2025
5. Fat steer or heifer born on or after 1st March 2025 and on or before 31st July 2025
6. Baby Beef steer or heifer born 1st August 2025 or after
7. Best steer or heifer under 560kg (11cwt) live
8. Best steer or heifer over 560kg (11cwt) live
9. Best steer or heifer any breed or cross bred by exhibitor
10. Steer or heifer of any breed or cross, fed by Exhibitor never having won a first prize at a previous Helston Fatstock Show.
11. Y F C/Young Handler Class - Steer or Heifer of any breed or cross, to be judged on the ability of the handler. Handlers to be age, 10yrs -28yrs, on the day of the show.

Recipe for Cornish Tea Loaf

|-------------------------------|---------------------------------|
| 1 Cupful of Mixed Dried Fruit | 1 Beaten Egg |
| 1 Cupful of Demerara Sugar | 2 Cupfuls of Self-Raising Flour |
| 1 Cupful of Cornish Tea | |

Method: Soak the fruit and sugar in a cupful of warm tea overnight.

Next day, add the flour and beaten egg. Put into a lined & greased loaf tin.

Bake at 375degF – 190degC – Gas mark 5 for approx. 30 minutes.

Recipe for Pineapple Fruit Cake

4 oz Butter	4 oz Plain Flour
8 oz Granulated Sugar	4 oz S.R Flour
1 tsp Mixed Spice	1 lb Mixed Fruit
1 tsp Bicarbonate Soda	2 Eggs
Can Crushed Pineapple (use 425g of a 435g tin)	

Method: Place sugar, pineapple and juice, mixed fruit, bicarb, spice and butter into a saucepan, bring to the boil for 3 mins. Cool completely. Sift flours together, mix into cold fruit mixture with well beaten eggs. Place into a greased and lined 8" cake tin. Bake on middle shelf – oven at Gas 4 – 180 C -375 F for 1 ½ hrs.
